## 2007 SCGA Senior Championship

Bluffton SC -Palmer, a Bluffton resident, shot a final round of 74, including an amazing 30 foot putt on the last hole to shoot a three day total of 218. When Palmer came off the 15th green he had a one shot lead over Ford, but two costly bogies on both 16 & 17 left the Belfair member one back coming into the tough 18th hole. Having to make birdie to get into a playoff, Palmer knocked his approach just off the fringe hole high left and then knocked in the fast 30 foot putt for the tie.

The playoff, contested on hole #18 and in the rain, was won with a routine two putt par by Palmer after a three putt bogey by Ford. This is the second consecutive year that Palmer has been part of playoff, losing to David Hambly in 2006 at Belfair Plantation.

The 2007 SCGA Senior Championship was played on the par 72 - 6,783 yard Nicklaus course at Colleton River Plantation in Bluffton, SC. The field consisted of 132 players over the age of 55 and was cut to the low 60 and ties after the first two days of play. 64 players made the cut at 163 or better.

**Charleston National Country Club in Mount Pleasant to Host Qualifying Event**

Charleston SC - The road to Pinehurst and the 2007 U.S. Kids Golf World Championship begins for many of South Carolina's best young golfers at the World Championship Qualifier at Charleston National Country Club in Mount Pleasant on June 19. The South Carolina World Championship Qualifier is among more than 50 qualifying events scheduled throughout the nation and in a number of international locations to determine the field for the world's largest golf tournament for kids 12 and under. Players may register for the tournament at [www.uskidsgolf.com](http://www.uskidsgolf.com). There is no handicap requirement to participate. The field for the South Carolina qualifier will include boys and girls who will play a shorter age- and gender-friendly version of Charleston National course. Depending on their age, participants will play either nine or 18 holes. The World Championship Qualifiers will help determine the boys and girls fields for the eighth annual U.S. Kids Golf World Championship, which will be played Aug. 2-4 at Pinehurst Resort and several other courses in the Southern Pines area of North Carolina.



**Stanley Finishes Second at NCAA Golf Tournament**

Clemson, SC— Clemson freshman Kyle Stanley's bid to become the school's first NCAA individual champion in 10 years fell short Saturday, but the ACC Player of the Year still finished second to complete one of the great individual seasons in Clemson golf history.

Stanley shot a final round 69 to finish with a 273 score for his four rounds and 72 holes on the par 70 Golden Horseshoe Course in Williamsburg, VA, just two shots off the pace of Southern California freshman Jamie Lovemark, who shot a 64 in the final round to finish with a 271 total. Ron Grube of National Champion Stanford, finished third with a 274 score after making a bogey on the final hole.

Stanley and Lovemark had competed for the nation's top freshman honor most of the year so it was fitting that the final round of the NCAA Championship was a battle between the two young players. Entering the NCAA national tournament, Lovemark had the nation's number-one individual ranking in the Golfweek/Sagarin rankings, while Stanley was eighth overall, second among freshmen. At the conclusion of the tournament Lovemark was named National Player of the Year and Stanley was named first-team All-American. Stanley is the first freshman in Clemson history to be named first-team All-American by the Golf Coaches Association.

## Legend's Resort lands on toughest courses list



Golf Digest has selected the toughest golf courses in the nation for the first time since 1966, and the Legends Resort's Moorland Course is ranked No. 37.

The listing of America's 50 Toughest Golf Courses appears in the magazine's March issue, which becomes available on newsstands today.

Moorland is a par-72 P.B. Dye design that doesn't kill players with its overall length of 6,800 yards but features a handful of long and tough par-4s.

The course also boasts rolling hills, some extreme mounding and elevation changes, deep and penalizing bunkers, waste bunkers, wetlands, lakes, areas of natural vegetation, railroad ties bordering many water hazards and waste bunkers, and large and severely undulating greens. Adding to the difficulty are a number of blind shots and elevated greens. It has a course rating of 72.8 and slope rating of 135.

The Ocean Course at Kiawah Island is the only other South Carolina course on the list, and is No. 1. According to the United States Golf Association, the Pete Dye-designed Ocean Course has the highest combination of slope (155) and course rating (79.6) of any golf course in the country.

Thirty-two of the 50 are open to the public, Pete Dye designed eight of them, and 26 states are represented on the list, which was determined by a collection of Golf Digest editors who have played all the courses in the ranking. North Carolina courses on the list are No. 7 Tot Hill Farm, No. 10 Tobacco Road, which was designed by Caledonia and True Blue designer Mike Strantz, and No. 32 Pinehurst No. 2 - which is far more difficult when the USGA prepares the course for a U.S. Open with fast greens and tightly cropped green surrounds. Other Strand courses that could make a case for the list of torturous layouts are True Blue, with a course rating of 74.3 and slope of 145; the Dye Club at Barefoot Resort, with a course rating of 73.3 and slope of 149; and Grande Dunes Golf Club, with a length of more than 7,600 yards, course rating of 77.3 and slope of 142.



### Men's Golf Finishes Fifth at NCAA Championships

The Chanticleers slip in the final round but still post the school's and Big South Conference's best-ever finish in any NCAA Championship. Senior Dustin Johnson concluded his career with a tie for ninth and earned his second straight First Team All-American honors.





Aiken, SC 64 teams competed in the 14<sup>th</sup> annual WSCGA State Team Championship at Woodside Plantation in Aiken on March 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>. The opening round four-ball format was played on Woodside Plantation's Cupp course, and the final round modified alternate shot format was contested on the Jones course. The team of Karen Ferree of Hilton Head and Donna Gonsalves from Bluffton won the Championship with rounds of 69 and 71. Lea Venable and Cecelia Barksdale, co-medalist of the tournament, finished second 3 shots back with rounds of 69-74.



**South Carolina Ties For 11th At NCAA Men's Golf Championships**

The University of South Carolina men's golf team finished in a tie for 11th place at the NCAA Championships, completed Saturday at the Golden Horseshoe Golf Club's Gold Course (Par 70 - 6,803 yards). The Gamecocks fired a final round 287 (+7) to finish the tournament with final score of 16-over-par 1136. Stanford won the team crown with an 11-under-par 1109 to capture the title by 12 strokes over runner-up Georgia. Southern California's Jamie Lovemark was the individual champion with a nine-under-par 271 after posting a final round six-under-par 64.

The 11th-place finish is the highest for the Gamecocks at the NCAA meet since the 1998 squad also placed 11th. It matches that squad for the second-best finish in school history behind only the 1988 team that finished in a tie for eighth place among 30 schools at the Championships held that year in Thousand Oaks, Calif. The Gamecocks placed 22nd a year ago in Sunriver, Ore.

Camden, SC- 2006 Carolinas Amateur Champion Scott McClellan and partner Dean Channell, both of Cary, NC held off finalists Taylor Hough of Spartanburg, SC and Daniel Neveu of Pinehurst, NC to win the Carolinas Four-Ball Championship, 2 and 1.

McClellan and Channell never trailed in the match gaining only a two-up advantage at any time.

Birdies were the order of business on the front nine, but high winds later in the day presented a rebellious back nine. Both teams threw out seven birdies on their first nine holes as McClellan and Channell turned with a one-up lead.

Neither team won a back-nine hole until a Hough birdie squared the match at the 14th. Channell countered with a par win on hole 15. McClellan sealed the 2 and 1 win with a 12-foot birdie on the par-4 17th.

“We had a tough bracket to get to the finals,” said Channell. “Which made this win that much more special.”

To reach the finals, the champions knocked off reigning North Carolina Four-Ball champions Brian and Mark Gauley; reigning Carolinas Mid-Amateur champion Walter Todd and partner Rick Cloninger; 2006 Carolinas Amateur runner-up (to McClellan) Whit Massey and partner Nick Hughey; and defending champions Robert and David Dargan.

The BI-LO Charity Classic is the largest one-day benefit golf tournament in the United States. 


## 39th Senior Four-Ball Championship
